Membership Renewal

It's time for several of our members to renew their memberships. Remember that AGO membership is no longer based on a July-June cycle, but is determined on an annual basis from the month you joined or renewed. If your membership lapsed in the past and you later renewed, your dues cycle may have changed, and **YOU** could be one of these people!

Membership is important! Your dues support the chapter and all the events it puts on. You'll have access to **member-only events**, such as the opportunity to play the organ in the Ogden Tabernacle in March. In addition, you'll get an **exclusive Salt Lake Chapter member rate** for the West Region Convention in June.

Go to *agohq.org/oncard-login* and sign in to your account. From there, you'll have an option to renew your dues.

You can request us to email your invoice to you if you don't currently have it.

For future renewals, a renewal notice is sent by email. Make sure your email is up to date in the ONCARD system by clicking "update personal information."

You can also opt to have national mail you a dues invoice via USPS in the future.

Event Reports

Salt Lake area RCYO Chapter Competition

The Salt Lake Chapter hosted a chapter level competition in the Quimby Regional Competition for Young Organists (RCYO). It was a close competition, with Sarah Maxfield winning the competition, and Dallin Baldwin as runner-up.

The competition was held at First United Methodist Church in Salt Lake City on their recently restored Bigelow & Co. organ. John Longhurst, Haruhito Miyagi, and Kenneth Udy served as judges.

Sarah Maxfield will compete as a finalist at the region level competition to be held Saturday June 10 as part of the 2017 West Region Convention here in Salt Lake City.

Sarah Maxfield, 16, performed "Prelude and Fugue in a minor" by J.S. Bach (BWV 543), "Salamanca" by Guy Bovet, and "LOBE DEN HERREN" as a hymn accompaniment. accrued a combined 17 years of organ, piano, viola, accordion, and voice lessons; attended 10 college organ camps, awarded RSCM organ scholar, and attended the 2016 Haarlem International Organ Festival in Holland. As a volunteer, she has accompanied choirs, served as a church organist, provided Christmas piano music at Macy's, and played for more than 200 hours outside the cancer and med-surg units of Primary Children's Hospital.

Dallin Baldwin, 23, performed "Toccata and Fugue in F Major" by J.S. Bach (BWV 540), "Andante Sostenuto from *Symphonie Gothique*" by Ch.M. Widor, and "MIT FREUDEN ZART" as a hymn accompaniment.

Dallin is an organ performance student at Brigham Young University in Provo, UT. He is currently the organist at Saint Mary's Episcopal Church in Provo. He has performed at different locations, including BYU Devotionals, freshman and sophomore recitals at BYU, the Air Force Academy Cadet Chapel in Colorado Springs, CO, and Saint John's Cathedral in Boise, ID. Dallin has always loved playing the organ and participating in choirs. He hopes to pursue graduate studies in choral conducting.

Ogden Tabernacle Organ Crawl

On March 18, the Salt Lake City Chapter hosted an organ crawl and lecture at the recently renovated Ogden Tabernacle. As part of the renovation of the building, the pipe organ was enlarged and reinstalled by H. Ronald Poll & Associates.

The original organ was installed 50 years earlier by Balcom & Vaughan. The enlarged organ now contains 54 ranks controlled from a 3 manual console. The organ features a trumpet en chamade, several percussion stops, and dual expression.

Members listened to a special presentation by those involved in the organ's reconstruction: Clay Christiansen (consultant), Mike & Timothy Poll (builders), and Bill Hesterman (tonal finishing). Clay Christiansen also demonstrated the organ's capabilities, finishing with a rousing improvisation. All attendees were given the opportunity to tour the pipe chamber and play the beautiful instrument.

It was wonderful being around friends, getting to know more about and listening to another one of Utah's fine pipe organs.

Convention Update

I'm excited about the upcoming West Region Convention this summer in Salt Lake City! My committee has worked hard to put together a wonderful event. Check out the program overview and other information below.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

As a convention attendee, you'll enjoy 23 concerts and recitals by a diverse group of artists, including Jaebon Hwang, Kimberly Marshall, Kenneth Udy, Pamela Decker, and Stephen Tharp. Richard Elliott will perform "Symphonie No. 2 for Organ and Orchestra" by Alexandre Guilmant with the Orchestra at Temple Square, and the Mormon Tabernacle Choir will perform a concert in their renowned home venue.

The convention will feature 9 of Salt Lake's many fine instruments. The city is home to two magnum opuses by major builders: the famed G. Donald Harrison Æoliean Skinner organ in the Tabernacle, which celebrates its 150th anniversary this year, and the newer 130-rank Schoenstein & Co. organ in the LDS Conference Center.

There are more than 16 great workshops planned which will offer something for everyone. From presentations on historic organist-composers such as Louis Vierne to contemporary ones like Dale Wood, workshops on choir and hand bells, numerology in the music of J.S. Bach, and a multi-part hands-on improvisation workshop, you'll leave the convention enriched. Two performance master classes on French Romantic music (with James Welch) and twentieth century music (with Pamela Decker) are planned. Attend the meeting of the west region and a keynote address by AGO Executive Director James Thomashower at a special banquet dinner--- all included with your convention registration!

Following a short intermission, the Mormon Tabernacle Choir, Orchestra at Temple Square, directors Mack Wilberg and Ryan Murphy, with organists Richard Elliott, Clay Christiansen and Andrew Unsworth will present a fulllength concert.

Wednesday June 14: Stephen Tharp. one of the world's most renowned concert organists, will present a concert of Romantic music and transcriptions for the organ on the V/130 Schoenstein & Co. organ in the Conference Center.

The convention will conclude Thursday June 15 with the 2 pm recital in the Tabernacle.

11 new compositions have been commissioned and will be premiered during the convention. These include a 9 hvmn based compositions from composers Franklin Ashdown, Bonnie Goodliffe, Clay Christiansen, Rulon Christiansen, Neil Harmon, Richard Elliott, James Kasen, Linda Margetts, and Andrew Unsworth. These selections will be published by Morning-Star Music which will be available for nurchase at the convention.

In addition, a new work for solo organ has been commissioned and will be premiered by Pamela Decker, and the Salt Lake Choral Artists under the direction of Brady Allred will premiere a new anthem for SATB choir and organ by Ryan Murphy.
